A MULTI-PURPOSE COMMUNITY HUB

Addressing the congregation at the official opening of the Centre, Mike Phillips said, "Lifespring church dreamed the dream of establishing a larger Church building that would also serve as a multipurpose community hub that makes a difference to the lives of people in this area; a Centre that would meet needs and bring people together". The Church, he felt, had kept its promise to the community.





Councillor Smedley, the Mayor, addressed the congregation who gave her a very warm welcome. She reminisced about her 50 years as a public servant in Ollerton. Two days previously, she had been re-elected as a Councillor - an election she had fought from her Hospital bed.

The Mayor went on to speak about her admiration for the way the church has cared for the community in its many acts of kindness; from food hamper to financial support. She thanked Lifespring Church for being a Church that looked out for its neighbour.

Mike Phillips went on to express his appreciation to all who had helped

make the dream reality and he finished by saying, "And a very special thank you to the people of Ollerton and Boughton. You are the ones who bring your children here; you are the

ones who eat, socialise and lose weight here. You are the ones who are helping us to keep the doors open, the lights on and the bills paid. Many thanks for your amazing support".

WORD for the MONTH "Dry Bones"

Ezekiel's vision of the valley of dry bones (Ezekiel 37:1-14) came to him after God had directed him to prophesy the rebirth of Israel in chapter 36.

Israel's present condition was dire. Israel was "dead" as a nation, deprived of her land and her Temple. She had been divided for so long that unification and restoration seemed impossible. So God gave Ezekiel the vision of the dry bones as a sign that Israel would be restored.

What possible meaning could this have for us today? It means that nothing is too hard for the Lord. God must not be underestimated. God has two amazing weapons -His Word and His Spirit. He said to Ezekiel to speak His Word over the bones and to breathe the breath of the Spirit into them. Then, they came to life.

Can these dry bones live? What are we talking about? A dead marriage? A severe bout of depression? A bereavement? A life without purpose? Can God do the impossible? Can our dreams be realised and our lives be resurrected? The testimony of the Bible is an unequivocal "yes". We will see the goodness of God; our marriages will be healed and people's lives can be restored.
